

THE ALL-AMERICA SELECTION IS ONE OF MANY ITCA PROJECTS

Dear Collegiate Tennis Enthusiast:

The Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches Association was founded in 1957 as a non-profit service organization and the same year we named our first ITCA All American Team.

Over the past quarter of a century, the ITCA has grown in size from a small group of Division I men's tennis coaches to an association which encompasses over a thousand coaches, representing both men's and women's college tennis in all three divisions of the NCAA and also the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). The ITCA All American Teams have also greatly expanded over the years. In 1983, we selected eight different All American Teams, one for each division, and a total of over two hundred players are now All Americans.

Although the All American Teams remain one of our most important projects, we are now involved in a large number of other college activities as well. These include:

1. The ITCA sponsors five major national championships per year. In 1983 these were: The Myrtle Beach Fall All American Tournament for Women; the Fall All American Tournament for Men; the ITCA National Intercollegiate Team Championships for Men; the ITCA National Indoor Intercollegiate Singles and Doubles Championships for Women; the ITCA National Indoor Intercollegiate Singles and Doubles Championships for Men.
2. The ITCA sanctions over fifty interregional collegiate tennis events. rankings for both teams and individuals.
3. With the sponsorship help of Head Racquet Sports, the ITCA administers comprehensive tennis Awards; the Head College Player of the Year; the ITCA Graduate Scholarships; the ITCA Scholar-Athlete Awards; the Osuna Award for sportsmanship and the Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship Awards; the All American Awards, and the Collegiate All Star Team Awards.
4. The ITCA has created a comprehensive set of rules governing collegiate tennis play and has its own Ethics and Infractions Committee to insure that these rules are followed.
5. The ITCA endorses a small, elite group of tennis industry and travel-related companies, which provide special discount rates to all ITCA coaches and teams.

All of the coaches of the ITCA are very proud of the level of play and the quality of sportsmanship exhibited in our world of college tennis, and we feel that our All American players over the past decades have exemplified these high standards. We are delighted to have the opportunity to honor these players from the past and present at our collegiate Tennis Hall of Fame Day on May 16th, during the centennial anniversary of the NCAA Championships and would like to thank the NCAA for letting us hold our Hall of Fame inducton ceremonies during its important championship event. And finally, we would like to express our deepest thanks and gratitude to Coach Dan Magill, who has been instrumental in helping us create our Collegiate Tennis Hall of Fame at the University of Georgia in Athens, Georgia, and who has been a guiding force behind all of our collegiate tennis activities.

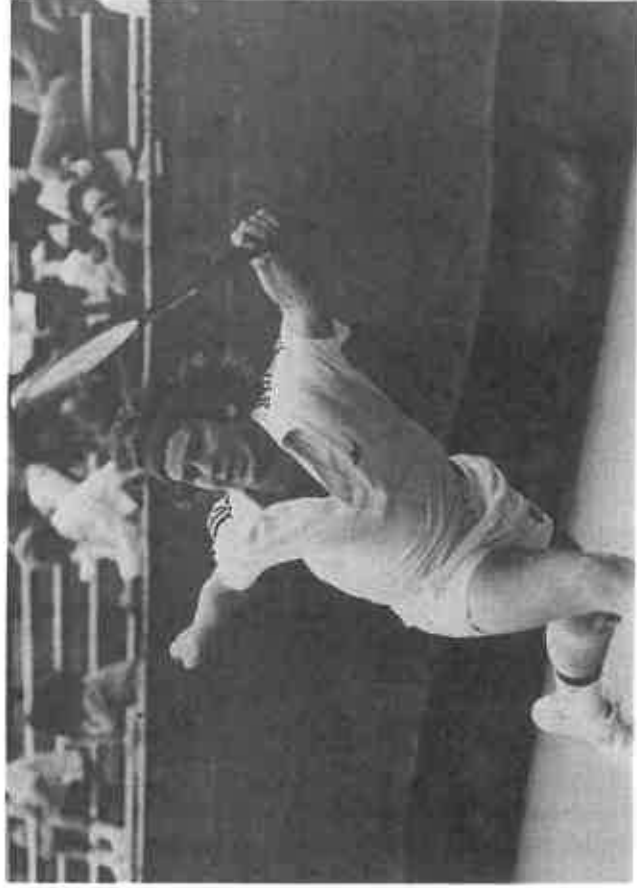
